

Thirteen community groups have shared in just over \$30,000 in funding from the AGL Hallett Wind Farm Community Fund for projects ranging from building repairs and security cameras, through to potting mix and landcare supplies.

Road resheeting in full swing

Despite a wet spring, our roads resheeting program has been full steam ahead.

Resheeting involves new road surfaces being laid and compacted across our large unsealed road network and we aim to make it a year-round project. Council allocates a substantial capital budget for these works and aims to resheet 75-85 kilometres each year. Over the past two financial years Council has made strategic investments in a bulldozer, impact crusher and stacker to produce high quality rubble for road construction – saving money on materials and ensuring we can undertake our own works, using local supplies, without relying on contractors.

Some rubble is not conducive to the impact crusher so traditional methods of carting raw rubble from the pit and using grid or rib rollers to break the material on the road are still used. This financial year, we will do 28% of the program with raw material.

Infrastructure Update



Pine Creek Bridge Tender

Tenders for the upgrade of the Pine Creek Bridge have closed and Council will soon choose a contractor to undertake the structural works to improve bridge safety.

We will provide community with a construction timeframe and further information about detours as soon as possible after the decision is made.

We anticipate construction to begin within a few months of the decision to award the contract and it will take about 3 -4 months to complete the works.

This is a significant project for our area and will deliver great benefits to our farmers and freight operators.

Footpath program

The community identified footpaths as a key asset in Council's survey several years ago.

Since then, upgrades in Gladstone, Laura and Jamestown have taken place. Before the end of 2022/23 major upgrades at Spalding and Yacka will also be completed.

The upgrade program will continue in coming years with Council currently determining its plans for the 2023/24 capital program.

Belalie Creek upgrade

Council staff have been recently undertaking works to tidy up the Belalie Creek and surrounding area including the historic Diggers Walk.

Works have included clearing up the reeds, removal of fallen branches, repairs to the small weirs, upgrades of the walking paths and general improvements to the green space.

RECYCLE RIGHT

WHAT CAN AND CANNOT BE PLACED IN YOUR 240It. GREEN/YELLOW BIN FOR FORTNIGHTLY RECYCLING:



- Paper and envelopes
- Newspapers, magazines, catalogues and junk mail
- Cardboard boxes and egg cartons
- Shredded paper (if contained inside a paper bag or box)
- Cartons such as milk, juice and stock cartons
- Pizza boxes without food scraps
- Aluminium and steel cans and tins
- Metal lids (contained in a steel or aluminium can)
- Empty and dry paint tins
- Empty aerosol cans
- Glass bottles and jars (rinsed with lids off)
- Plastic bottles and containers (rinsed with lids off)
- Yoghurt and butter containers (rinsed with lids off)



- Plastic lids from jars and bottles
- Plastic bags and other soft plastics
- Food scraps
- Packaging contaminated with food
- Tissues and paper towel
- Clothing and fabrics
- Polystyrene foam packaging
- Foam trays and cups
- Crockery or drinking glasses
- Mirrors, light globes, oven-proof or window glass
- Car parts
- Toys
- Nappies
- Garden waste or organic material
- CDs, DVDs, video or audio tapes

Single Farm Enterprise

Did you know that if you own two or more pieces of rateable farmland in the Council area you may be classified as a 'single farm enterprise' which means only one fixed charge may be imposed against the whole of your land.

If you feel you may be eligible, you will need to make an application to Council.

If you have not completed an application form - or have purchased, sold, subdivided or amalgamated any land or changed your entity since you submitted your last application - you can contact our Jamestown, Gladstone or Spalding Offices to receive a form.

Or visit our website and download a form today: nacouncil.sa.gov.au/services/rates.

Forms must be completed and returned by 5pm on Friday 30 June 2023.

If the application form is not received by the due date, no exemption will apply to the 2023/2024 financial year fixed charge component of your rates.

A majority of farming entities have already completed a form, are receiving a Single Farm Enterprise and therefore a reduction on the fixed charge component of their rates.

My Local Services App

My Local Services app is a smartphone application designed to deliver local council information to residents of South Australia.

It's free to download and easy to use on any Apple or Android smartphone devices. Once you have installed the app, you can you do things like:

- Personalise the app to only show information for Northern Areas Council
- Check which waste bin is due each week
- Receive weekly waste collection reminders the night before
- Find out what's on in your local area
- Locate your nearest council facility including community centres, libraries, playgrounds, toilets, and council buildings
- Report an issue like a broken bin or damaged council infrastructure to the council

Once a report is completed from your smartphone it is then sent directly to Council and passed on to the relevant staff.

Downloading and installing the My Local Services app onto your smartphone is easy. It is available on Apple App Store or Google Play.
