

# Council's Christmas Message



The Northern Areas Council would like to wish community members a very Merry Christmas and best wishes for a happy and prosperous 2023.

It's been a very busy year, with Council continuing its regular works program, in addition to delivering approximately \$6m in grant funded projects.

With this funding, Council has been able to deliver much needed upgrades to community facilities such as Town Halls, Swimming Pools and Sport and Recreation facilities.

Footpath upgrades have taken place in addition to improvements to play-grounds. Council has sealed several previously unsealed township roads, as well as community areas includ-

previously unsealed township roads, as well as community areas including the re-seal of the runway at the Sir Hubert Wilkins Aerodrome in Jamestown. This facility serves as key infrastructure for the Royal Flying Doctor Service on a regular basis and the Country Fire Service during the warmer months of the year.

Council has completed various upgrades to enable better disability access to public areas, and also a range of community facility upgrades. Council has expanded the Solar Energy installations, which will save costs for both Council and the community immediately.

Work is continuing with the preparation of final design specifications for the upgrade of the Pine Creek Bridge near Laura. Council has secured just over \$2.9 million in Bridges Renewal grant funding from the Federal Government, toward the end cost of over \$3.6 million. This will not only enable the bridge to be open to large trucks, it will also see the bridge widened to ensure greater safety.

Council recognises the large number of bridges across our unsealed road network and their importance to commodity transportation. Operational Services staff are continuing to work toward a long term plan to maintain this key infrastructure and upgrade where appropriate.

On a positive note, the recent Australian Census, again listed the Council area as being home to one of the highest rates of volunteers in Australia. We wish to thank those hard working volunteers for the terrific work they undertake.

We look forward to working with you all again in 2023 and Safe travels for those who may be on the road during the festive season.

# **Dog Control**

A reminder that all dogs must be registered with the statewide dog and cat registration system (DACO) which can be accessed online at <a href="www.dogandcatsonline.com.au">www.dogandcatsonline.com.au</a>. Council's Dog Control Officer carries out dog registration checks at various times throughout the Council area, and dogs found to be unregistered are liable for a fine of \$170.

Another reminder that it is a requirement for both dogs and cats to be microchipped. Microchipping **does not** replace registration in DACO.

If your dog or cat is deceased please contact Council so that the DACO records can be updated and therefore avoid renewal reminders and possible fines. If your dog or cat is transferred to another owner in a different Council area the DACO records must be updated and also if you become an owner of an animal registered already in DAO your details as an owner must be updated within 14 days of taking ownership.

Cats <u>MUST</u> also be registered in the DACO system although Council does not charge fees. Renewal notices are issued for cats at the same time as the dog registrations are due for renewal. Cat owners are advised that they must ensure that their cat's details are kept up-to-date in the DACO system.

Council administration staff are able to help with any queries about dog and cat registrations.

#### Did you know?

In South Australia, you <u>must</u> keep your dog on a leash no longer than 2 metres unless in an off-leash area marked by Council signage. <u>Leash up</u> for dog's sake! Most dog attacks reported to Councils happen when dogs are off-leash. Leashing your dog can save you, your dog and others a lot of pain and anguish.

When your dog is on a leash, you and your dog are safe. It's not worth the risk, leash up!

# **Pine Creek Bridge Update**

Pine Creek bridge has historically been burdened with a 30 tonne weight restriction. Council recently engaged Engineers to undertake an assessment of the bridge sub-structure/superstructure. They then provided remediation cost estimate for increasing the gross tonnage from the current 30 tonne weight restriction. Council then lobbied the outgoing Federal Government for funding that would target the IBridges Renewal Program (BRP) & Heavy Vehicle Safety Productivity Program (HVSPP) and in doing so was successful in securing \$2.98m of the Engineers cost estimation of \$3.66m for remedial works that would increase the current 30 tonne weight restriction.



Council has further engaged the services of engineer consultancies to undertake a detailed design that can be used to support the planned Request For

Tender (RFT) for the Pine creek Bridge remedial works. The detailed design is now approximately 75% completed which allows for Council going to RFT early in the new calendar year.

# **Stormwater Management**

Council has organised the services of Engineering consultants to formulate Stormwater Management Plans (SMP) for Georgetown, Gladstone, Laura & Spalding. The cost is \$200k which is 50% co-funded by Stormwater Management Authority (SMA). These plans will be completed by financial years end, June 2023, and the availability of the SMP's will give insurers and property owners a higher degree of confidence concerning local flood water behaviour;

# **Bridges on the Council Road Network**

A level 3 structural assessment has recently been undertaken on the Hill River Road wrought iron bridge which currently has a weight restriction of 68.5 tonne. This stems from the level 3 structural assessment which has outlined works needed to lift the weight restriction and maintaining the existing single lane access.





# **All Abilities Playground Equipment**

Council have recently purchased a new All Abilities swing set, which has been installed at Memorial Park in Jamestown.

Council will progressively incorporate such improvements in future playground upgrades as part of its Disability Access and Inclusion Plan.

# **Fires Danger Season**

The Fire Danger Season is from the 15th November 2022 to 30th April 2023

The fire danger season has commenced and with this in mind Council inspectors have begun checking properties for compliance.

Please continue to look at your property on a regular basis and make sure your property is maintained so that you are preventing fire from starting on or moving through your property. Fire prevention is an OBLIGATION OF ALL LANDOWNERS.

# **Property Preparation Checklist**

Maintain your lawns, groundcovers, shrubs, trees and garden beds.

Slash or mow long grass and remove cut material from the land.

Remove weeds around the house. Don't have any shrubs or trees leaning against the house or overhanging the roof. There must be at least 20 metres of maintained ground around the house.

Remove weeds around garages, carports, sheds and fences. Don't have any shrubs or trees leaning against them.

Remove leaves and any dead weeds from gutters and consider gutter guard systems to help reduce the accumulated leaf litter.

Remove fallen branches and other debris.

Do not have a creeper or vine growing on a poly rainwater tank

Check and service all of your mechanical equipment, including grass cutters, water pumps, sprinkler systems and extinguishers.

Review and update your Bushfire Action Plan. Remember to include your pets in this plan.
